Screening and Assessments: StarCare's dedicated, licensed staff provide outreach, screenings, assessments, and referrals to those who are actively seeking substance use services and/or support. The OSAR team conducts verbal screenings to gather information pertaining to the severity of use and how use has impacted day-to-day functioning or mental health to provide appropriate referrals to recovery resources.

-Interventions: Following the screening and assessment, individuals can expect short-term case management services in addition to the opportunity of up to six brief motivational interviewing sessions with their OSAR counselor.

-Support: OSAR counselors are available for additional support and case management until the individual successfully enters their referred treatment service. Our OSAR counselors also remain as a point of contact for future recovery support needs.



-For uninsured or underinsured individuals, the OSAR Team can determine if you are approved for full or partial financial assistance toward your referred treatment services.

To qualify for the Pregnant Postpartum Intervention program individuals must:

- Be pregnant or postpartum (includes the period from birth through 18 months of infancy)
- Reside in one of the 41 Region 1 counties



- Be identified as being at risk of having, or who have, a substance use disorder. Risk factors include:
- Teen pregnancy (including females through age 19);
- Current or past involvement with Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS) or other child protective services agency.
- Current or past use/abuse of, or dependence on, alcohol and/or drugs;
- Current or past domestic violence;
- Current or past mental health problems, especially perinatal mood disorders
- Living in a household with a person who abuses alcohol or drugs;
- Current or past history of sexual, emotional or physical abuse;
- Insufficient, late (third trimester) or no prenatal care; or
- Financial distress
- Be referred by the Department of Family and Protective Services or who are identified as being at risk of having, or who have, a substance use disorder and who have children under the age of six.

-SUSAN is the City of Lubbock's substance use disorder network for community health workers. SUSAN has two dedicated Case Managers and two dedicated Community Health workers to assist the public for the area of Region 1. This program is designed for male and female Texas Residents with substance use disorders. The goal is to screen and address social determinants of health and provide harm reduction methods and tools to help others live a safer, healthier lifestyle. SUSAN provides syringe cleaning kits, wound care kits, hygiene kits, and overdose reversal kits including Naloxone and pre-exposure Prophylactic (PREP) education information. Susan offers assistance with residential and outpatient treatment, which is determined by screening for substance use disorder. Assistance can also be provided for sober housing, transportation needs, and help with prescription medications, vision, hearing, clothing, employment, and educational needs. SUSAN employees understand that there are no two people alike, so each plan is individualized to address the needs of that particular person.

Fees for Subutex (buprenorphine) are an initial set up fee of \$149.00 and then \$140.00/week payable at \$20/day. The total intake fee for Subutex is \$289 which includes the first week's dosing. Participants are responsible for paying for the week regardless of attendance – staff are present and ready to assist you.

Other patient guidelines will be explained at time of screening and intake if you choose to participate in the program.

- What to expect when you apply to the Driskill Halfway House.



- Applicant will submit a \$250.00 nonrefundable processing fee to DHH. This payment is separate from and in addition to any rent required to paid upon admission. The processing fee shall be paid in separate check payable to DHH when applying.
- The applicant will provide adequate information for a criminal background check to be conducted. DHH does not currently accept Applicant with conviction for violent crimes or Applicant who are required to register as sex offenders.
- Applicant MUST be sober for at least 30 days. Upon arrival to the facility, Applicant will provide a Negative UA (urine analysis) to be administered by DHH staff. A positive result will exclude Applicant from entrance to the program.
- Personal items will be checked when Applicant arrives at the facility to ensure compliance with DHH rules. Applicants will be provided with a copy of DHH rules and policies prior to arrival.
- The monthly rent is \$450.00 which includes room and board.
- Upon admission, each resident will have a PIN assigned to them which will allow them access the secure entrance to our facility.

-Public Housing in Lubbock

• The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) administers housing assistance to residents of the City of Lubbock through the Housing Authority of the City of Lubbock (LHA). In this capacity, LHA is the owner and manager of approximately 304 housing units scattered throughout Lubbock. These units provide housing for low income families, the elderly, and disabled individuals at rents they can afford. Tenants of public housing units pay 30% of their income toward their rent. Any additional costs are subsidized with federal funding. Through this program, around 1100 Lubbock families can receive rental assistance.

-Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers (HCV)

Over 900 Lubbock families receive rental assistance through our Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher program. The Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program allows low income citizens to find their own places to rent in Lubbock. Voucher holders are free to choose any house that meets minimum health and safety standards. Once a family finds a home that they wish to rent, LHA must inspect it to make sure that it meets HUD's housing quality standards. LHA also checks to make sure that the rents are reasonable and within the fair market rent range for Lubbock. Households assisted through the Section 8 program pay 30% of their income toward the rent. Then LHA pays private landlords the difference between what participating households can afford and the rent for the units. Through this program, over 900 Lubbock families can receive rental assistance.

-Section 8: Project Based Voucher

 Section 8: Project Based Vouchers are part of a government-funded program that provides rental housing to low-income households. These may be in privately owned and managed rental units. The subsidy stays with the building; when you move out, you no longer have the rental assistance. Most tenants will pay rent based on 30% of their adjusted income; the voucher will cover the rest.
